# PRIMARY ACTIVITY SHEET

Her Place: Women in The West

**Purpose:** 

To be able to form arguments and be able to structure them into a speech relating to a contemporary issue surrounding women's

rights in Australia.

**Activity:** 

Preparation and Materials:

#### Preparation:

- Debate topics written on the whiteboard.
- Teacher overview of excursion.

#### Materials:

- Planning sheet (attached)
- Student books
- Pencils

## **Procedure:**

#### Step 1.

Students split into groups of eight.

#### Step 2.

Each group is given a debate topic:

- Australia should have a women's museum.
- 50% of all politicians should be women.
- Female AFL players should be paid as much as men.

### Step 3.

Teacher to split each group in half and delegate which group is for and which group is against.

#### Step 4.

Students get 20 minutes to plan their arguments. Each student on the 'for' and 'against' teams will have a role: the presenter of the opening statement, the presenter of the first argument, the presenter of the second argument, and the presenter of the closing statement; with each student understanding that they have one minute with which to present a rebuttal and new argument.

#### Step 5.

Students both perform a debate on their given topic, and become active audience members while watching other groups. Each debate should take roughly 8-10 minutes. The rest of the class observes the debate and, at the end, takes a vote on which side 'wins'.
